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PROENERGY EPC SERVICES AWARDED TERMOZULIA PROJECT

ProEnergy EPC Services to collaborate with state-owned power company.

ProEnergy EPC Services has been awarded the contract for the Termozulia project in Maracaibo, Venezuela. The project will consist of engineering, procurement and construction of a 170 mega watt gas and diesel fired power plant in the country's second largest city.

ProEnergy EPC Services will work closely with Enelven, one of the 10 state-owned power companies merged under Corpolec, the Venezuelan government entity in charge of electricity. When fully operational, Termozulia will supply Enelven's 400,000 customers with 25% of their power needs. The project began October 4, 2009 and is planned to complete in nine months. "ProEnergy is excited to be working with Enelven on this project," said ProEnergy Services President Jeff Canon. "Opportunities to help meet the need for power throughout the world is one of the driving forces in our business."
