

ProEnergy: Expansion and Growth

ProEnergy is expanding the campus at its Sedalia, MO., headquarters and construction has already begun on a 20,000-square-foot fabrication building. The facility will be engineered to support 10-ton and 5-ton cranes, which will be used for fabrication of steel carbon, stainless steel and pressure vessels the company requires. The work is expected to be complete in early November.

An additional 40,000 square feet will be added to the fabrication building in two phases. The next phase likely will be an expansion to allow the company to do turbine repair. Another phase will be 5,000-square-feet of offices for engineering and computer-assisted drawing (CAD) support. Jeff Canon said he expects to have about 50 people working out of the building by early 2009.

Another addition to the ProEnergy campus will be a two-story, 24,000-square-foot corporate office. (Pictured

Because of recent growth, ProEnergy has staff working from three different locations in Sedalia.

"We want to bring everyone under one roof," Canon said, adding that he expected the building to have more than 40 offices and multiple conference rooms. "We're not big on work stations. It's important to us that our employees have a nice work environment."

The office building will also

include a 1,200-square-foot training center for the training programs that ProEnergy provides to its employees, as well as to its customers.

Septagon Construction, of Sedalia, is handling the design-building projects for the 20-acre campus.

In addition to the Sedalia headquarters; ProEnergy has U.S. offices in Atlanta and Houston and overseas locations in Argentina, Mexico, Venezuela and Ghana.

Pinckneyville Power Plant is located in Pinckneyville Illinois. Plant staffing consists of Lead Technician – Bruce Clarry and Plant Technicians – Sam Opp, Dennis Kellerman and Dave Haggard.



Plant staff has managed to maintain all eight units and Balance of Plant (BOP) equipment in a “Ready to Start” mode, answering the call of a total of 152 Dispatched Starts throughout the months of June and July without one failed start attempt. Even more impressive is the fact that the Pinckneyville crew has responded to a year-to-date total of 489 starts on these units. This is an outstanding accomplishment for which the Pinckneyville crew deserves hearty congratulations!



Above and beyond coordinating the daily efforts of plant staff, Bruce Clarry coordinated and conducted successful Annual CTG Maintenance and Inspections on all eight units. Bruce also continues to work on the Preventive Maintenance Program verifying we have identified all the maintenances we should be performing as well as attaching procedures to these.

On the forefront of everyone’s thoughts and concerns everyday, along with generation of electricity, is ensuring that the plant is in compliance with all environmental regulations and requirements. In this realm of responsibility, Sam Opp has taken the lead. He has done an outstanding job in coordinating special testing and permitting w/ Ameren and other entities as well as overseeing the day-to-day operation and maintenance of the “not so user-friendly” CEMS units. Sam has allowed us the ability to rest a little easier at night knowing that these concerns are in good hands and being managed efficiently.

In a continuous effort to provide Ameren with the highest numbers in Availability and Reliability, ProEnergy Services is in the process of implementing some Predictive Maintenance Programs throughout the Ameren Facilities. One of these programs is Vibration Analysis. Dennis Kellerman has stepped up to the plate and has taken the initiative with this program and has installed all the
